Your gate card will be your "ticket" in during the air show hours of 7am to 5pm.



Upper State New York Airport 2013Winter operations

- Please remove salt blocks from your vehicle when entering the gate. As you drive and or park your
 car salt blocks may fall off your vehicle causing dangerous conditions for yours and others props.
 A prop strike into this hard matter is enough for an engine tear down. Should salt blocks fall off
 please toss salt blocks clear off taxiways and ramps.
- If you utilize the office, please make sure heat is at 55 when departing, and <u>inside</u> office bathroom door is left <u>open</u>.
- During the winter months if you come out alone...bring a cell phone and warm gear. It gets cold quick
 if you are hurt or stuck! Let friends/family know when to expect you home!
- YAKTRACKS ...They will <u>help</u> keep you on your feet especially when there is black ice! If you do not own a
 pair now please consider buying them for yourself and friends that fly often with you! They may be purchased at most sporting goods stores.
- HEATERS...only <u>approved</u> heaters, (Tanis, natural gas installed professionally) Propane heaters <u>outside</u> only! Please **do not** leave <u>any</u> external heating source unattended! Keep all combustibles away from all heating sources. Remember, its not **just** your airplane that may go up in flames!
- The vehicle road will remain usable, however, that is the last area that gets plowed. Caution
 using this road in the Winter it has unforgiving slopes especially when coated with ice!
